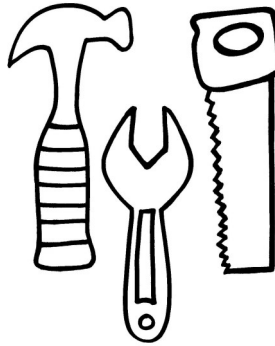

What does a Carpenter do?

- Construct, renovate and repair structures made of wood, steel, concrete and other materials in the residential, commercial and industrial construction sectors and in related industries

Where could a Carpenter work?

- Construction companies, carpentry contractors, and maintenance departments of factories, or self-employed
- Variety of different work sites, both indoors and out

What is needed to become a Carpenter?

- 3844 to 7200 Hours of combined on-the-job and in-class training for this apprenticeship
- Grade 10 or equivalent (Grade 12 or equivalent is recommended)
- Certificate of Qualification exam available

How much money could a Carpenter make?

- A Carpenter could make, on average \$23/hour
